10th International Conference on Low Carbon Asia Successfully Held at Dalian University of Technology's School of Economics and Management 21st to 24th September 2024

The 10th International Conference on Low Carbon Asia was successfully held at Dalian University of Technology from September 21st to 24th, 2024. The 10th installation of the conference series was jointly organized by Dalian University of Technology, the Dalian Institute of Chemical Physics of the Chinese Academy of Sciences, and the Universiti Teknologi Malaysia. The event was co-hosted by the School of Economics and Management of Dalian University of Technology, the Low Carbon Strategy Research Center of the Dalian Institute of Chemical Physics, the Liaoning Coastal Laboratory, and the UTM-Low Carbon Asia Research Centre, with the collaboration of the School of Environmental Science and Engineering of Shanghai Jiao Tong University, the Department of Geography of Beijing Normal University, and the Institute of Ecological Environment Protection of the Shanghai Academy of Agricultural Sciences.

The theme of this year's conference was "Sustainable Transitions towards a Resilient and Carbon-Neutral Future," covering a comprehensive list of topics on low-carbon city planning and smart cities, sustainable energy systems, sustainable waste and water management, environmental pollution mitigation, clean technology and regulation, green economy, circular economy, sustainable agriculture and food supply, ESG (Environmental, Social, and Governance), sustainable investment, finance and development, carbon asset management, and sustainable governance. The conference attracted more than 150 scholars from nearly 55 universities and city-level officials across 13 countries.

Professor Shanti Faridah Salleh from Universiti Malaysia Sarawak accepted the conference flag, announcing that the 11th International Conference on Low Carbon Asia will be hosted by Universiti Malaysia Sarawak in Kuching, Sarawak in year 2025.
